Above includes an amount of repetition, e.g. the town's grocers are each involved in some other form of commerce (that is, if we assume that *John* and *James Reilly*, Sradeen, refer to one and the same premises ?). Four of them were bakers as well, a common feature right into the next century. It will be noticed that most of the shops are congregated in the Main-street/Square section and in Sradeen. A closer inspection of

this directory throws up eleven different commercial outlets.

Bridge-street refers to the northern end of Strand Street, while *Castle-road* probably refers to Bluepool Lower. Pigot's, like other postal directories, classifies people under occupations.

It would appear that the Post Office was in Peacock-lane bounding the Square [formerly D.C. Daly's.] Mails from Dublin & Mallow arrived on Sunday, Wednesday and Friday evenings at 7-45 and departed on Monday, Thursday & Saturday mornings at 6 am.

Saturday was market-day and there were six fairs in the year: March 17th, May 4th, July 4th Sept. 29th, Nov. 4th and December 11th.

This is the earliest directory of the town and the first to mention individual streets comprehensively.

William Seymour, tanner, Market Square, was a convert to Roman Catholicism and his eldest son, Richard, was ordained priest, became Parish Priest of Carrigwohill where he died in 1885.
