

FAMILY NAMES, KANTURK and DISTRICT, 1550-1750

Latin was the legal language of Tudor and Stuart England. *Fiat justitia* meaning 'Let justice be done' explains the meaning of *Fiat*: an order of Court. 'Fiants' is the Anglicized form of the plural. Depositions, on the other hand, refer to evidence given to any statutory inquiry or inquisition by deponents whose names are listed.

N.B.: Owen MacDonogh MacCarthy, alias Mac Donogh, gent., was he who died in Limerick imprisoned by the English, father of Dermot Mac Owen to whom was granted the lordship of Duh allow, June 1615.

In his *Records of Cork, etc.*, Brady has Dermicus Se(?c)hully, Vicar of Kilbrin, 1591. This may be the Dermot O Scolly mentioned above. A yeoman was the English name for a strong farmer and head-tenant. Gallowglass, from the Gaelic, meant a professional soldier.
